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Call for Expressions of Interest (EOI) – Nephrologists with an interest and expertise in Hypophosphatemic Management

On behalf of Dr Richard Prince, University of Western Australia, we are seeking Expressions of Interest from Nephrologists with the relevant expertise who are interested in joining a Hypophosphatemic Management Working Party.

Dr Prince is forming the Working Party with multi-disciplinary expertise to develop a guideline to support best practice care delivery for adults with hypophosphatemic bone disorders.

What's involved?

You will join a multi-disciplinary Working Party with expertise in bone and mineral metabolism, endocrinology, orthopaedics, rheumatology, dentistry, allied health and consumers.

As a Nephrologist with a special interest and expertise in this area, you will advise on the development of diagnostic criteria, management guidelines and mechanism to survey and monitor the prevalence of hypophosphatemic bone disorders in adults and potentially children.

An overview of the Working Party's tasks and deliverables is attached to this call for EOI. The project is expected to take up to 12 months and involve monthly Working Group meetings.

Please note that if you are selected, you will join the Working Party as a Nephrologist with expertise in hypophosphatemic bone disorders, not a representative of the ANZSN.

The ANZSN will review the outcomes and recommendations of the Working Group prior to and as a condition of endorsing any guideline or registry proposals and submissions to Government.

Advice provided by Dr Prince on the Working Party's agenda, deliverables and timeline

The Working Party's agenda is extensive and will include:

1. Develop diagnostic criteria for adult hypophosphatemic bone disorders especially adult XLH
2. To develop a framework for management guidelines of adult hypophosphatemic bone disorders XLH
3. including transition to adult care.
4. Develop a program to survey the prevalence of adult hypophosphatemic bone disorders especially adult XLH
5. Work with the Australian Paediatric Registry to develop questionnaires suitable for adult participants to
6. examine the potential of a combined paediatric adult registry.
7. Provide independent advice to Governments on indications if requested.
8. Other ideas that arise as a result of discussion from meetings
