2021 ANZSN Leadership Award for an Outstanding Contribution to Education and Teaching, Clinical Care, Health Policy or Advocacy

Purpose:

The ANZSN Leadership Award recognises outstanding leadership in Nephrology as demonstrated by a significant contribution to one or more of the following areas of education and teaching, clinical care, health policy and advocacy at a national and international level.

Eligibility:

All financial Ordinary Members and Life Members are eligible for the Award. Any such member of the Society who applies or is nominated by another member, and who fulfils the criteria, shall be considered for the award. Where nomination is by another member, the ANZSN Office must confirm with the nominator that the nominee accepts the nomination.

An applicant must have held membership of ANZSN for at least 12 months prior to applying or being nominated for the Award.

An applicant for the Leadership Award cannot also nominate for the TJ Neale Award within the same two-year period. In addition, the same application, including Curriculum Vitae, cannot be used for both awards i.e. the application must address the specific criteria for each award.

The winner of either the TJ Neale Award or the ANZSN Leadership Award cannot apply for the other award within a five-year period.

Criteria:

The Scientific Program and Awards Committee (SPARC) shall recommend to the Council the candidate who is deemed to have made the most significant contribution to Nephrology over the preceding five years through their leadership in one or more of the following areas:

- Education and Teaching
- Clinical Care
- Health Policy
- Advocacy

Candidates must be ranked by their peers as a key opinion leader in Nephrology, with international standing and a demonstrable track record of achievement and impact at a regional or global level. This award recognizes outstanding leadership in Australian and/or Aotearoa

New Zealand kidney health that is over and beyond standard expectations in leadership across clinical, academic and research capacities.

Notes

- a) "Outstanding contribution to" will be judged on leadership positions held, publications and awards aligned with the eligibility criteria. Candidates must demonstrate a contribution to Nephrology at an international level.
- b) All applications will be considered relative to opportunity, the details of which should be provided in the nomination cover letter.
- c) Each candidate should provide SPARC with a one-page précis demonstrating their international standing and contribution to education and teaching, clinical care, health policy or advocacy.
- d) The SPARC may call upon independent external assessors, who may be members of the Society, to make recommendations for the award.
- e) The Council of the Society reserves the right not to make an award in any particular year.
- f) A period of no less than five years must have elapsed between the nomination of a candidate for this Award and any successful awarding of the TJ Neale Award, and vice versa.

The prize will be formally awarded at the 2021 Annual Scientific Meeting. The selected candidate will be invited to make an address at the ASM on their particular field of knowledge.

Nominations must be no longer than five (5) A4 pages in length, excluding a list of publications if relevant.

Applications must be submitted by Sunday 9 May 2021.

Late applications will not be accepted.
