



Professor Ainslie Glenister Ross Sheil AO

Ainslie Glenister Ross Sheil was educated at the Southport School in Queensland. He was a fine student, receiving awards in all years. He was Dux of the school, House Captain and Prefect. He represented the school in all sports. He was awarded a Rhodes scholarship in 1956, taking up the scholarship in Balliol College, Oxford. He received BA (Oxon) in 1959 (MA Oxon 1964) he also received BSc (Oxon) in 1962. He was elected Fellow, Royal College of Surgeons (1962), Fellow, Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (1966), Fellow, American College of Surgeons (1971), Master of Medicine (Sydney University) 2001. He was appointed Senior Lecturer, Department of Surgery, University of Sydney (1966-1978), Associate Professor, University of Sydney (1969-1978) Head, Department of Transplantation Surgery Royal Prince Alfred Hospital (1973-2001), Professor of Surgery (in the Field of Transplantation) University Sydney (1978 to 2001). He was Chairman and Director of the Australian National Liver Transplantation Unit based at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, Royal Alexandra Hospital for Children, the Westmead Children's Hospital and Sydney University between 1986 and 2001.

In 1992 he was awarded Order of Australia and became an Honorary Life Member of the Australian Kidney Foundation and Transplantation Society of Australia and New Zealand. In 1994 he became Honorary Life Member of the Australian and New Zealand Society of Nephrology.
